PostBus as a company (1) A story that dates back more than 100 years

- 1849: Establishment of horse-drawn postal network
- 1906: First scheduled motorized delivery route between Berne and Detligen (replaces a horse-drawn carriage route)
- 1919/1920: Conversion of 40 army vehicles into Postbuses, resulting in more than 12 new routes in the Central Plateau region – a significant development
- 1921: Introduction of Alpine Post: Opening of Grimsel, Furka, Bernardino and Oberalp passes
- 1930: Replacement of almost all horsedrawn routes (with the last remaining route in Graubünden only closing in 1961!)
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PostBus as a company (2) From the Alps to the cities

- 1946: Opening of the Susten Pass and start of an era which included the famous three and four-pass round trips which still remain favourites today
- 1956: Ticket machines are installed in 50 Postbuses
- 1965: The first, modern, sheltered PostBus station was built above the platforms of the main railway station in Berne
- 1969: The first articulated Postbus was brought into operation
- 1980: PostBus began operating the city buses in Bellinzona

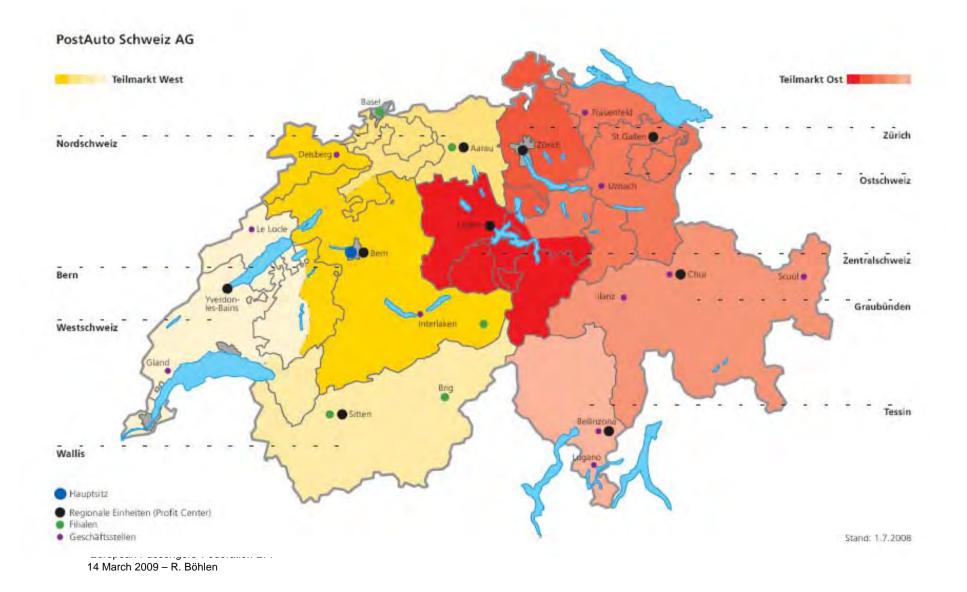

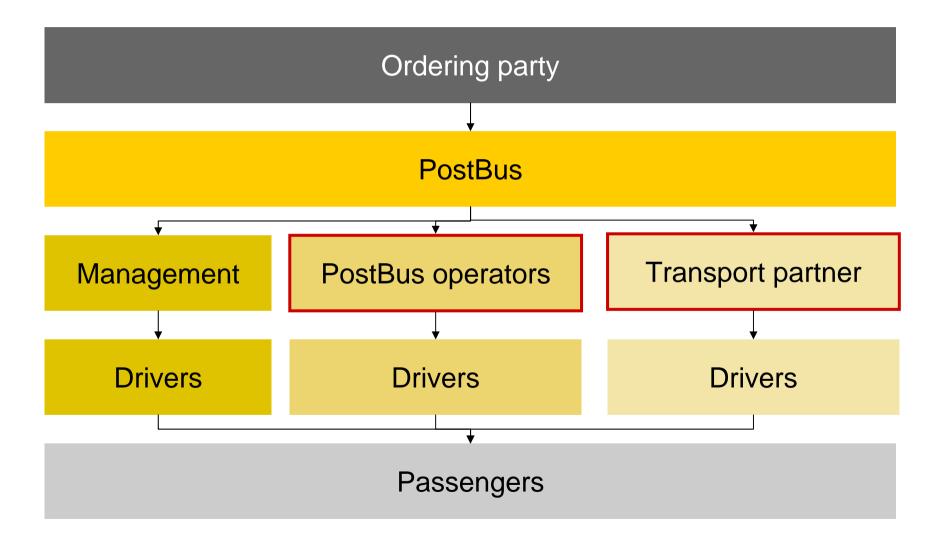

The following operating conditions apply to all business models:

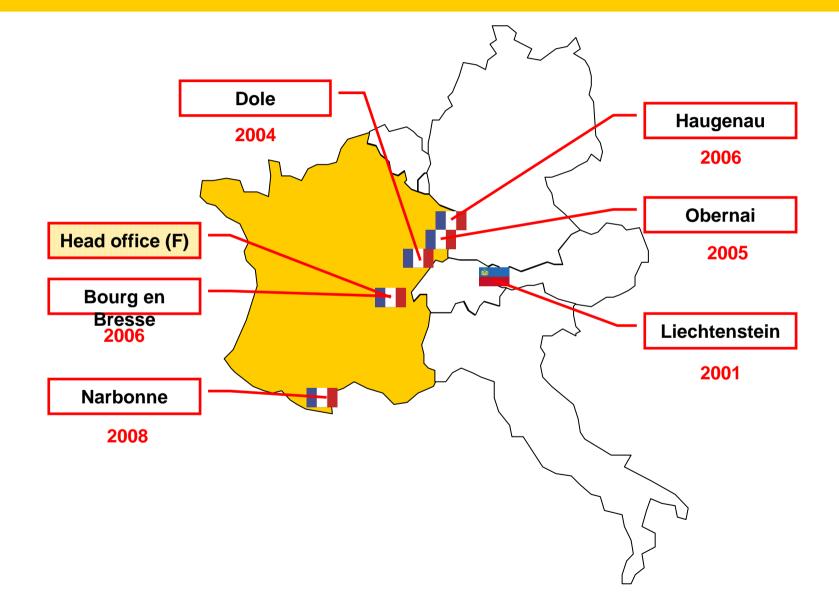

Change of strategy in three key parameters

2001 - 2007

- 1 Geography: idea of proximity → reduced perimeters +/- 200 km around Switzerland
- 2 Target markets: predominantly urban, small and medium-sized towns and conurbations
- 3 Market entry: by **winning** tenders

Since 2008

- 1 Geography: interesting areas for public transport → e.g. eight regions throughout France
- 2 Target markets: **urban** (mediumsized towns and conurbations) and **regional transport**
- 3 Market entry: tenders, cooperation agreements with independent companies and/or company acquisitions

Growth abroad (3)

Start of strategy implementation in Germany and Italy

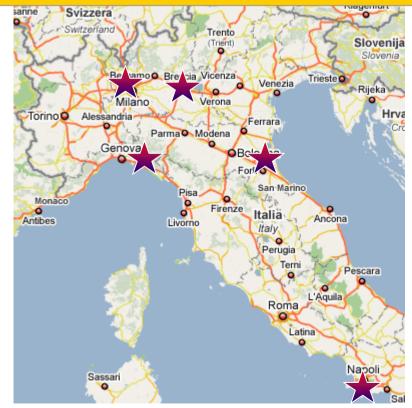
Germany in 2008:
