Structure of public transport in the Netherlands

- Separation between rail network and train companies
- ProRail owns the network (100% state company)
- Open access for cargo
- The main network is run by NS (100% state company)

Political question: what is the main network?

Regional lines are run by other companies (FR and DE owned)



The structure of regional public transport

- 18 regional authorities are responsible for public transport
- trains/trams/metro/busses/ferryboats
- Private companies have to bid to get a licence
- Amsterdam/Rotterdam/The Hague have municipal companies



Structure of Rover

- Non-profit association with 5600 members
- Annual general assembly
- Board meets monthly
- Small staff in Amersfoort
- Working groups
- Local and regional branches
- Publicity
- Lobby



Legal structure

- Legal basis in the WP 2000
- National platform of consumer organisations (LOCOV)
- members
- Regional platforms (ROCOVs)
- members
- Information/consultation/publication
- Concessions/fares/timetables/etc.



How does it work?

- LOCOV is taken seriously
  - Fear of bad publicity
  - Minister/civil service
  - Parliament
  - Input!!!!
- ROCOVs vary
  - Quality of persons
  - Attitude of regional authorities and companies
- Lobby and publicity strengthen consultation
