> Be patient: progress takes time



> First, perfect the message



- Distil down into a simple core idea
- Adapt for each audience
- Use familiar terms
- Repeat, repeat, and repeat

> Is it in Commission's competence?



- Legal basis in Treaties or acquis?
- Subsidiarity constraints?
- National sensitivities?

Identify a current policy peg



- Declaration, Initiative or Programme?
- White paper?
- Communication?
- Road map?
- Parliamentary pressure?

Develop thinking with officials



- Align with their concerns
- Present idea in their terms
- Take their advice on how to proceed
- Show personal appreciation

> Build stakeholder alliances



- Use networks
- Identify areas of over-lapping interest
- Orchestrate interventions in meetings
- Think long-term: know when to back off for now

What we must not appear to be



- Obsessive nerds
- Nostalgia-driven rather than reason-led
- Disproportionately critical of nonpublic transport modes (valued by most citizens)

Not forgetting our trump cards

- What we say is evidence-led, not assertion-driven
