
Project at a Glance



InclusiveSpaces:


- realizes the inclusive design, monitoring and evaluation of urban space.

The planning and design tools and climatefriendly assistive technologies will be **demonstrated, assessed**, and **evaluated** in **6 demo sites:**












Mobility Station "Kiosk"






Highlights and Next Steps
